

Warm-un

Do some stretches to gradually warm up and stimulate blood circulation

This helps prevent injuries, knee pain, fatigue, etc.

Cool-down

The ancient temple belonging to the Tendai Sect is called Shinnozan Kannon-in Temple. Its main statue is a seated statue of Amida Nyorai. Myokenson Temple standing on the top of Mt. Myoken is managed by the temple as a Bettoji (temple attached to a shrine), conveying the religious mixing of Shinto and Buddhism to the people of today.



This is a private religion established in the early Meiji period. It is thought to have been started in 1879 when Rihei Matsuura, who lived in Momura, became a practitioner under the name Mokujiki Fukan and visited many provinces to pray. It peaked from the 1880's to the early Showa period.

Tate-jinja Shrine



The shrine is located in Tatedai in Momura, and is said to enshrine Raijin (the god of thunder). The detail of its founding is unknown, but the words "Established in 1764 by shrine petitioner Gonnojo Matsumoto" are inscribed in the stone of the foundation of the main hall.
